TAHC Rule Proposal Open for Public Comment

Chapter 40, Chronic Wasting Disease

AUSTIN, TX – The Texas Animal Health Commission (TAHC) held a regularly scheduled Commission meeting July 16, 2024, at its headquarters in Austin.

The following amendments were proposed during the meeting and are open for comment from August 23 – September 22, 2024.

Chapter 40, Chronic Wasting Disease

The proposed changes eliminate all surveillance zones and all other references to surveillance zones throughout the section. Additionally, the proposal eliminates all requirements related to surveillance zones, including carcass movement requirements.

The amendments propose a new containment zone in Coleman County in response to the detection of CWD in a free-range white-tailed deer, and a new containment zone in Collingsworth County in response to high-risk elk from an adjacent farm.
